



ABOUT US

- Edison is the oldest energy company in Europe.
- It sells electricity and natural gas and provides energy and environmental services to 1.1 million end users.
- It oversees integrated activities throughout the electricity and gas value chains and aims to be a key operator in the sector in Italy, playing an active role in consolidating both the retail market and energy efficiency.
- It operates in Italy, Europe and the Mediterranean basin, with around 5,000 employees included Fenice, which it acquired in 2015*.
- Since 2012, it has been controlled by the EDF (Electricité de France) Group, the European leader in the electricity sector and a key driver behind the transition towards a low-carbon energy future.
- In 2016, it adopted a new brand platform: "Let's build a sustainable energy future together." Edison has worked in collaboration with EDF to support its new business direction, which focuses on sustainability and customers.







MILESTONES

Edison was Italy's first electricity company and is also one of the oldest energy providers in the world:

- 1883 The first facility in continental Europe for the commercialisation of electricity is built at the Santa Radegonda theatre in Milan.
- 1884 6 January: the "Società Generale Italiana di Elettricità Sistema Edison" is founded.
- 1931 Edison supplies gas to the families of Milan.
- 1962 Following the nationalisation of the electricity sector, Edison begins to produce its own electricity.
- 1966 Montecatini and Edison finalise merger. Montedison becomes a chemicals colossus.
- 1979 SELM (Servizi Elettrici Montedison) is founded.
- 1999 With the introduction of the Bersani decree, Edison moves into free energy market.
- 2002 Montedison, Edison, Sondel and Fiat Energia merge to create the "new" Edison.
- 2005 Control of Edison passes to Transalpina di Energia, a joint venture between Electricité de France and Delmi, a group of Italian investors led by A2A.
- 2008 Edison enters the residential electricity market and launches gas supply offering for Italian families.
- **2012** Edison's ownership structure changes again and the company is now controlled by EDF (99.48%)
- 2015 Creation of the new renewables "hub" E2i Energie Speciali.
- 2016 On November 7, Edison launches new brand to back up business strategy
- 2017 Focus on added-value service offering






CURRENT EDISON GAS PORTFOLIO

- Italy: third-largest gas market in Europe
- Edison is the Gas Platform of EDF Group
- Edison's share of Italian market: ~20%.
- LT contracts ~ 90% of Edison's supply portfolio.
- Conclusion of gas contract renegotiations has made it possible to align prices with market conditions.

Overall contracted offering 14.4 billion m3/year*

EUROPEAN ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE



- 80% capacity availability of the Adriatic LNG terminal for the import of liquefied gas from Qatar until 2034.
- Management of gas transport pipeline from the Adriatic LNG regasification terminal to the Miberio hub.
- Small Scale LNG projects.

Feasibility checks on **infrastructural projects** for the import of gas via pipelines.



- Second-largest sector operator in the country.
- Management of three natural gas storage centres in Collalto, Cellino San Marco and San Potito-Cotignola.




PIPELINE PROJECTS

IGI Poseidon S.A. is a Greek law firm jointly owned by DEPA S.A. and Edison International Holding (100% subsidiary of Edison S.p.A.).

The company is working to develop three large pipeline projects as part of the South Gas Corridor transport system: the Poseidon and EastMed pipelines and the Greece-Bulgaria gas interconnector.

In recognition of their contribution to energy security in Europe thanks to the diversification of natural gas supply routes and sources, the projects being developed by IGI Poseidon are categorised as Projects of Common Interest, the highest priority level in Europe.



POSEIDON - 100% IGI Poseidon SA

- Offshore section of the ITGI project
- Length: 200 km will link Greece and Italy via the Ionian Sea
- Capacity: 20 billion m³ per year

EASTMED - 100% IGI Poseidon SA

- The onshore/offshore EASTMED pipeline will link Cyprus and Israel with Italy and Greece via the Poseidon pipeline;
- Length: 1,900 km
- Capacity: 10 billion m³ per year


IGB - 100% IGI Poseidon SA

- The IGB pipeline will make it possible to link Bulgaria with Greece and other gas markets in Southeast Europe;
- Bidirectional interconnection between Greece (Komotini) and Bulgaria (Stara Zagora);
- Length: 180 km
- Capacity: 5 billion m3 per year
